Big-hearted small team needs a win

WHEN the Newcastle Wallsend Touch Association's next competition begins in May, there will be a team on the field that is much smaller than the others.

The team, Salties Juniors, has the right number of players but out of a squad of 15, there are only three

adults.

The rest of the team, both boys and girls, is aged from nine to 14.

The team has played in a mixed adult competition with mixed success. Its final game is on Friday and so far it has drawn two games and lost the others.

The team was formed when several adults who were playing noticed that there was a bunch of children who watched the games and 'were hanging around on the sideline', team member Dennis Skinner said.

Dennis and two women are the only adults in the team and they give guidance to the younger players. There is always one male and one female adult on the field during games.

Dennis said the young players did not have the speed of the adults but had a great deal of ability and a never-ending supply of energy.

Players from other teams tended to be fairly careful when playing the younger team at first but soon played them the same as other teams when they begen to score a few tries.

Dennis said he was keen to see more children playing touch football in the next competition. None of his players had suffered any serious injuries and they had all enjoyed playing very much.

From these beginnings, some passionate members put the effort into to getting more Juniors involved in playing Touch. Ron Andrew, Debbie Sault, Debbie Swan and Raylene Russell put their heads together to start running Juniors at Wallsend. As Debbie Sault recalls, the many phone calls to schools, players etc, the mountains of paperwork – draws / referee cards, all done at home and in their own time.

In 1997 Wallsend Touch formed a separate committee to run their Junior side of the game. A group of dedicated parents formed this committee with Linda Knowles (as President) and Shane Farrell (Vice President) at the helm. Many of the parents played in the Senior Competition, so it wasn't unusual to see people 3 or 4 times a week. A real family atmosphere was created. No one played their game and went straight home, they would sit on the hill with a beer, mix and mingle while watching a few more games. No one was in a hurry; life was less complicated back then.

When the Junior Committee kicked of their were 670 children playing, 125 of those indigenous kids. The committee collaborated with Awabakal Elder Jimmy Wright in supporting many of our Indigenous kids to play Representative Touch. Taking the Rep teams away was a highlight of the Touch season. In Linda Knowles words "the best representative competitions were held at Penrith. One year we booked the players and families into a caravan park. On the Saturday night the committee took on the mammoth task of putting on a BBQ for all staying at the park. We may have started off as strangers that night but we made lifetime friends by the end of the weekend. Over my 39yrs being involved in Touch Football – this weekend was my absolute favourite".



Our under 8 and 10s girls and boys teams finally got to play!


